About Communion at Grace

At Grace Lutheran Church, we follow the historical practice of closed Communion. The Lord's Supper is the meal that Christ our Lord bequeathed to the Church on the night when he was betrayed as his last will and testament. In the Supper, we receive the true and substantial body and blood of Jesus Christ which grants to each believing participant the forgiveness of sins. Since those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood without discerning his true and substantial presence do so to their great harm (1Co 11.27), we must, for the sake of love and pastoral care, ask those who are affiliated with other church bodies, or are not affiliated with any church body, to refrain from partaking of the Lord's Supper at Grace. Guests from sister congregations of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod are asked to speak briefly with the Pastor prior to the service. We thank you for honoring us and our confession of faith by helping us to faithfully practice closed communion at this altar, until the time when we may receive the Supper together in true and blessed unity!

2 Samuel 24:15-25

And the angel of the LORD was by the threshing floor of Araunah the Jebusite. ¹⁷Then David spoke to the LORD when he saw the angel who was striking the people, and said, "Behold, I have sinned, and I have done wickedly. But these sheep, what have they done? Please let your hand be against me and against my father's house."

¹⁸And Gad came that day to David and said to him, "Go up, raise an altar to the LORD on the threshing floor of Araunah the Jebusite." ¹⁹So David went up at Gad's word, as the LORD commanded. ²⁰And when Araunah looked down, he saw the king and his servants coming on toward him. And Araunah went out and paid homage to the king with his face to the ground. ²¹And Araunah said, "Why has my lord the king come to his servant?" David said, "To buy the threshing floor from you, in order to build an altar to the LORD, that the plague may be averted from the people." ²²Then Araunah said to David, "Let my lord the king take and offer up what seems good to him. Here are the oxen for the burnt offering and the threshing sledges and the yokes of the oxen for the wood. ²³All this, O king, Araunah gives to the king." And Araunah said to the king, "The LORD your God accept you." ²⁴But the king said to Araunah, "No, but I will buy it from you for a price. I will not

offer burnt offerings to the LORD my God that cost me nothing." So David bought the threshing floor and the oxen for fifty shekels of silver. ²⁵And David built there an altar to the LORD and offered burnt offerings and peace offerings. So the LORD responded to the plea for the land, and the plague was averted from Israel.

¹⁵But the free gift is not like the trespass. For if many died through one man's trespass, much more have the grace of God and the free gift by the grace of that one man Jesus Christ abounded for many. ¹⁶And the free gift is not like the result of that one man's sin. For the judgment following one trespass brought condemnation, but the free gift following many trespasses brought justification. ¹⁷If, because of one man's trespass, death reigned through that one man, much more will those who receive the abundance of grace and the free gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man Jesus Christ.

¹⁸Therefore, as one trespass led to condemnation for all men, so one act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all men. ¹⁹For as by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous. ²⁰Now the law came in to increase the trespass, but where sin increased, grace abounded all the more, ²¹so that, as sin reigned in death, grace also might reign through righteousness leading to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.







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Announcements

The following precautions have been implemented at Grace while the coronavirus is spreading across our country (these are recommended by The LCMS and many are aimed to prevent people from touching things that others have touched):

- You are encouraged to spread out throughout the sanctuary.
- *New for this week:* Please do not walk up to and visit with people entering the church or seated in the sanctuary.
- There are no greeters. Please pick your bulletin up at the table.
- Hand sanitizer is available at both entrances to the church and at the bulletin table.
- Ushers will hold on to the offering plates. They will not be passed down the pew.
- There are no fellowship pads to pass around.
- There will be no shaking hands with the pastor or others.
- Holy Communion is the Body and Blood of Jesus. The chalice has not been found to transmit diseases.
- The elders will be washing their hands prior to distributing the Sacrament. Pastor will wash his hands prior to the service and use hand sanitizer prior to the distribution.
- *New for this week:* You will not be ushered to come forward for Communion. Stand two pews back from those in front of you. There will be no kneeling. Receive the Body of Christ from the Pastor. If you wish to receive the chalice, wait for him to give it to you; otherwise step aside to receive your individual cup.
- Door handles and light switches have been disinfected.
- For those staying home with flu-like symptoms (or are at-risk) may receive a DVD of the service by calling the Church Office.
